Plans are in the works for our summer event in 2020. We have decided to rename our even year event Destination Ring! At this point, I can announce that it will in Lake George, NY in August 2020. # Area 2 2019 Festival Class Descriptions

# **Advanced Treble Techniques**

This class will begin with basic techniques while using four-in-hand as well as variations on traditional four-in-hand. We will also cover options for six-in-hand.

# **Advanced Solo/Ensemble Techniques**

This class will delve into some of the more advanced techniques, taking your solo ringing to the next level. We will learn and practice techniques to help provide a legato ringing style, including multiple bell techniques, displacement of bells, finger damping and traveling 4-in-hand.

# **Basic Treble Techniques**

This class will cover the challenges facing the treble section of the handbell instrument. We will cover basic techniques as well as weaving, shelley and four-in-hand ringing.

# Bass Bell Techniques

Ringing on low bass handbells (2s and 3s) requires a very specific approach in regard to physical health, proper ringing technique, the execution of other techniques, assignments and setups. A foundational course, this class will focus primarily on the absolute beginning of bass bell ringing, up to and including assignment ideas for Level 1 and 2 handbell music. Mallets are required! Please bring your own.

# **Beginning Solo/Ensemble Ringing Techniques**

This class will provide an introduction to some beginning techniques useful in solo and small ensemble ringing. In this hands-on class, we will practice weaving, bell switching, bell passing, and bell displacement, all of which are also useful in full choir ringing.

# Bell Trees 101 & 102

101 - In this introduction to bell trees, participants will learn about the equipment required and accessories available for adding bell trees to worship services/performances. Ringers will practice stringing trees and playing some simple music to get the "hang" of this wonderful option.

**102-** Beyond the Basics – This class goes beyond basic bell trees, studying Barb Brocker's Bell Tree Keyboard setup and practicing some additional techniques including mallet-damping and 2-in-hand malleting. We will look closely at several of her arrangements and discuss learning strategies.

# **Bells and Contemporary Worship**

Join the band! Writing Handbell Arrangements to Enhance Your Contemporary Worship –

Have you thought about adding handbells to the praise band? In this collaborative class we will work together to create handbell arrangements that will go with the band. We will first learn how to read a chord chart, then to write our own arrangements. No music writing software necessary!

### Bring the Notes off the Page

So you've learned the notes, yay! This class will focus on the next steps to a beautiful, musical performance. While ringing handbell repertoire in a variety of levels, we will discuss how to bring out and enjoy the musicality with the piece. In addition, we will talk about how directors can prepare their score, and help their ringers play every note musically and how ringers can listen more globally to the entire piece, and not just their two notes.

# **Choosing Repertoire & Concert Programming**

This class will discuss the factors involved in selecting music for your handbell program, including commissioning music for your choir. Ever been to a really exciting handbell concert that had you on the edge of your seat? Then again, ever been to that bell concert that put you to sleep? Come to this class and learn how to put together that handbell concert that will KNOCK THEIR SOCKS OFF!!

# DIY - Singing rods

Come make your own singing bell stick. Donation for materials will be taken.

# DIY – Tie-dye gloves

Come make your own tie-dye gloves. Donation for materials will be taken.

# **Doubling Down with C2 – B3 Choirchimes**

If you own or hope to own an extended range of Choirchimes, this class is for you! Ensure the life of your instruments by learning more about the science behind their design and use. This session will demonstrate the proper way to ring low chimes as well as incorporate them into a score. Composers are encouraged to attend to learn more about writing for these instruments.

# **Forum on Community Choirs**

Are you part of a Community choir? Thinking of starting one? Bring your questions to this forum and talk with directors of 3 established community choirs (Raleigh Ringers, Detroit Handbell Ensemble and Capital Ringers) about how they started, their organization, and how they created their "identity."

# **Forum on Conducting**

Are you a new director who got pressed into service and needs help with basic conducting patterns? How about going from 3/4 to 6/8 or conducting 7/8? Do you need hints on how to get your ringers to watch you? Bring your questions (and solutions!) to this forum.

# Making Excellent Rehearsals Happen

How do you make the most of the precious rehearsal minutes you have with your handbell group? We'll discuss thorough planning before rehearsal, efficient execution and strong leadership during rehearsal, and casual analysis after rehearsal.

# **Malmark Maintenance**

Come learn how to care for your Malmark bells. Bring any "trouble" bells you may have.

# Maori Sticks, Fun with

Learn the traditional game of the Maori people and develop some awesome handbell skills while you are having a blast.

# More with Less - Adapting the music to the Ringers you have

This workshop will highlight ways to use the ringers you have (usually fewer than you wish) with the music you want or need to ring. Bring your ideas along, too. We will all discuss and share ideas which work and maybe even some which don't and why. Bring gloves just in case!

# Multimedia as the Backdrop

Using multimedia technology to enhance concert and worship presentations is a great way to create an "experience" for audiences and congregations. The use of still imagery, videos, and special lighting will be shown in video examples. In addition, an overview of the software and equipment available will be presented.

### Plink! Plank! Plunk!

In this class you'll learn and review some of the frequently used handbell techniques and how to "voice" them with your choir or ensemble to achieve a consistent sound.

# **ENDORSEMENT? YES, YOU SHOULD!!**

Do you run a great handbell event? Is it endorsed by Handbell Musicians of America? Why the bell not?

# What IS endorsement?

Simply put, an endorsed event has the official thumbs up from Handbell Musicians of America (HMA). Any individual or organization belonging to HMA can submit an endorsement request for an educational handbell event. Workshops, festivals, reading sessions, seminars, and conferences are all classified as educational in nature. While the event must be presented by an HMA member, one does not necessarily need to be a member to attend the event.

Endorsement should not be confused with sponsorship. A *sponsored* event is an official event presented by HMA Area leadership - the biennial Area 2 Festival Conference, for example! Only HMA members can attend sponsored events.

# Why should my event apply for endorsement?

Endorsement gives you the marketing and advertising power of the HMA national office. You can have your event listed on the national website as well as in the Overtones publication. For an area wide event, you can also request data for members in your target area so that you can contact or advertise to your target demographic directly. HMA will also cover ASCAP and mechanical licensing fees for your endorsed event. Legally, this is something you should already be attending to yourself!

Endorsement also gives you the structured legitimacy of our national organization. By joining your event with the larger HMA community, you contribute your fellowship to the musical art of handbell ringing. We are a small community when compared to the choral, orchestral, or band world, but we are strong and vibrant because of the dedication and enthusiasm of members.

# How do I apply for endorsement?

Forms for endorsement application are available on the national website, <a href="www.handbellmusicians.org">www.handbellmusicians.org</a>. There is a convenient search function at the bottom of the home page to assist your navigation if you're having trouble locating the forms. Completed forms are reviewed and approved by the Chair of Area 2 before they are passed on to the national office. You can also e-mail Vickie Iverson at the national office, <a href="wiverson@handbellmusicians.org">viverson@handbellmusicians.org</a>, with any endorsement specific questions.

# WHEN IS YOUR MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL DATE?

Understanding the Changes in HMA Membership Renewal, by Jean Coniber

You have probably read or heard about the new membership renewal changes. The highlights of the change are that:

- 1 On October 1, 2019 all memberships will be reset to expire on March 1, 2020, unless members have chosen an earlier date of either November 1, 2019 or January 1, 2020; and
- 2 Regardless of which renewal date is chosen, benefits of membership will continue to be available until March 1, 2020.

The main reason for the change is to concentrate the renewal effort to a shorter time period. If your membership has ever lapsed for a month while paperwork was in process, you've probably gotten a reminder email from me in addition to reminders from the national HMA staff. Rather than do that every month, the change will let us concentrate our renewal reminders during just a few months of HMA's fiscal year.

The new schedule also lets the national and area boards do our budget planning with more information up front, knowing how much income there will be from membership for the year.

But what's in it for you, the members? Well, of course what's good for the organization is also good for the individual members. And for me, and other members like me who would have renewed in the fall of 2019, we get several extra months of membership (until March 2020). It gives me (and I suppose about half of us) extra money in the calendar year of 2019 to spend on music or equipment.

For members who already had renewal dates around the spring time, it won't make much difference. There are some members, though, who renew in the summer, who may feel like they are losing some months of membership. Those members will still renew just once in 2020, but they will need to renew in an earlier month than they are used to. Once this change is made, we'll all continue to renew once a year, on the new schedule.

# A note from your Communications Coordinator:

Area 2 sends an e-newsletter to our members each time a new Twice Tolled Tales has been published or when there is important news that we want you to receive. If you do not receive our e-newsletters, you will need to log onto your national HMA member account to subscribe.

- Go to the national website: handbellmusicians.org
- In the black bar across the top of the screen, click on "login"
- Enter your login name and password
- Once you are logged in, on the right side of the screen, there is a drop down menu that says: "What would you like to do?"
- Click on this drop down menu, then click on "subscribe to e-newsletters"
- The screen says: "please choose your email subscription" You may select more than one subscription.
- The first option is for the national "e-notes" (These come from National HMA, and are very informative)
- Then there are options for Area 5, 3, 7, 6, 9, and 4
- Next, there is another national option for event notes (This is different from the e-notes listed above; we suggest that you subscribe to this also)
- Next, you will see the option for Area 2. Be sure that the Area 2 option is selected!
- Once all of your subscription selections are "checked", scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the blue "subscribe" box.

You should now be all set to receive the selected e-newsletters in the future.
