Besides giving **you** access to the National website "members-only" information, a copy of *Overtones* Magazine (HMA's quarterly publication), voting privileges, and access to national and area events, it also gives **everyone in your choir** access to events! But there are other types of memberships as well.


- 1. Each of your ringers can have a sub-membership for only \$10 a year. This will give them access to online resources as well.
- 2. There is a student membership for \$25 a year. This gives you access to online resources as well as the online *Overtones* issue.
- 3. There is a Retired Handbell Musician membership for \$70 a year. You can still have all the privileges above for yourself after you no longer have a choir.

Membership in our organization gives us opportunities to make life-long friendships with other handbell musicians. Together we can do things no one can do alone!

One thing National has changed in the last year or so however, is the time of membership renewals:

This has brought about some confusion as we strive to have all renewals happening in March of the year. If a new member joins our organization prior to September 30, they will have to renew again in March. So, monthly memberships are offered for \$9 a month. If your membership were to start after October 1, your first year membership would actually last for a year and a half.

Area 2 continues to offer mentoring workshops for new members if they are interested, as well as recognition in our Twice Tolled Tales. Dr. William Payn - Festival Director

As music director and conductor of Pennsylvania's Susquehanna Valley Chorale for over twenty years, one of Bill Payn's major contributions to the Susquehanna Valley has been consistent quality performances enriched by a balance of traditional classical music with innovative new choral/orchestral works. He has "raised the bar" for introducing inventive and unique programming with a vision to inspire and engage audiences of all ages. With over 50 compositions to his credit, Payn's choral and handbell works represent distinctive, original music performed regularly throughout the world in major church and concert venues.

He recently retired as former chair of the music department, professor of music, and director of choral studies at Bucknell University where he led his choirs to international recognition. His Emmy-nominated Bucknell Candlelight Christmas production continues to be aired every holiday season on public television throughout the U.S.

In addition to his many professional accomplishments, awards and recognitions, Payn is often the guest festival conductor, headliner and clinician at hundreds of events throughout the world. Musicians and former students (who affectionately call him "DP") refer to his "clear, concise conducting - easy and free in motion and conveying beauty of musical phrase coupled with a caring attitude for each person and an insistence on the very best participation - never accepting second best."

Payn received a bachelor's degree in church music/organ from Westminster Choir College and master's and doctorate in organ and harpsichord from West Virginia University. Recently, Bucknell University (through the generosity of Robert and Natalie Rooke) honored him with the William A. Payn scholarship, an endowment fund that annually provides full tuition to a talented and promising incoming music student. He also was presented recently with the Elaine Brown Award for Choral Excellence by the American Choral Directors Association for outstanding lifelong work in the choral arts. Bill and his wife, Ruth, enjoy visiting their children and 11 grandchildren, world traveling and relaxing in the quiet countryside on their organic farm (Walnut Acres) along Penn's Creek in rural Central Pennsylvania.

KAREN BUCKWALTER

Masterclass Clinician

Karen Buckwalter, a distinguished organist, pianist and composer, served as a full time Minister of Music for 37 years in Hanover, PA. From 2002 until retiring in 2014, she served as Associate Minister of Music at St. Matthew Lutheran Church in

Hanover, where she was privileged to play a 241 rank Austin organ, one of the ten largest organs in the world.

Ms. Buckwalter is a 1974 graduate of Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ and a 1977 graduate of The Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, where she earned the prestigious Artists Diploma in Organ Performance. In 2005, she returned to the classroom at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg, PA and was commissioned as an ELCA Deacon. Internationally known in the field of handbell composition, Ms. Buckwalter composed her first published work, "Danza" in 1982. Recognized for her original compositions such as "Soliloquy for Bells" and "Nocturne in a minor", she now has over 90 handbell/choral compositions in print. She has earned enthusiastic praise for her creative compositions, her colorful harmonies and her use of chromatics that have raised the musicality in handbell music as a genre.

Sought after as a handbell conductor/clinician for workshops and festivals throughout the US, her works have been performed and recorded in the United States, England, France, Estonia and Japan. Now, in "retirement," Ms. Buckwalter continues her work as a conductor and composer and enjoys playing her 38 string lever harp.

All applicants must be members of Handbell Musicians of America (at time of event)

All applicants must be currently directing or under contract to direct a handbell/handchime choir or using handbell/handchimes in a school program in Area 2. Applications must be postmarked by April 25th of the year in which the award is being sought. A committee appointed by the Chair of Area 2 will review all applications and select the recipient. Area 2 reserves the right to award all, some, or none of the scholarships based upon the number of applicants, their qualifications, and allotted funds available. The decision of the Area 2 Board is final.

Previous winners of the Garee Scholarship are ineligible to apply, as are members of the Area 2 Board. Winners will be notified by May 30th, of the year in which the scholarship is being awarded.

General instructions for completing your registration

Please make a copy of all forms for your records. Be sure to mail the original.

Each registration form must be signed by an authorized adult (director of the choir, pastor, etc.), acknowledging the refund policy where indicated on the enclosed form. Forms not signed will be returned.

Refund Policy - If cancellation of your registration is made prior to June 1, 2021, Area 2 will refund all registration fees paid except the \$50 per person deposit.

If the cancellation is made after June 1, 2021, **NO FEES WILL BE REFUNDED.**

The Early Bird Discount is offered to HMA members only. To take advantage of the Early Bird Discount, registrants must meet the following two deadlines:

- 1. Complete Deposit for the group/individual attending must be POSTMARKED by February 28, 2021.
- 2. Complete Total Balance Due must be POSTMARKED by May 31, 2021.

<u>Failure to meet either of these postmark dates will cancel the discount and result in ALL</u> registrant fees being due based on the Postmark requirements of May 31, 2021.

Handbell Musicians of America Fee Requirements: to be eligible for regular registration fees, all participating choirs and individuals in the 2021 Festival must be members of the Handbell Musicians of America. Handbell Musicians of America membership helps to offset costs incurred by both the Area and National (e.g. insurance, royalties, etc.). Directors (or the organization they represent) or individuals who are not currently members of Handbell Musicians of America may attend the Festival Conference but MUST pay a higher registration fee. Individual ringers are covered if their director or organization is a member. Your individual or organization membership number must be included on the registration. It can be found on your *Overtones* label.

Membership: For those who wish to join the organization before registering, membership information can be found on the National website: www.handbellmusicians.org. Click on the membership tab and follow instructions.

Area 2 adheres to copyright laws. Absolutely no copies of music may be used at the festival. Area 2 reserves all surprise inspection rights.

Housing - When making your housing plans, please remember one chaperone, 21 years or older, must accompany every 6 ringers of the same gender under age 18. Additional information will be made available to you.

Festival T-shirts and Polo Shirts: <u>Shirts are not included in the registration fee.</u> Festival shirts will be available for purchase online. If you wish to order a shirt, you may do so using the link included in the Festival packet information to be emailed to you after your registration has been processed.

For your convenience, the Festival Packet forms and all registration information will be available on the Area 2 website. You are encouraged to use this resource to help Area 2 save on postage costs. The Area 2 website can be accessed at www.area2.handbellmusicians.org
