Reflections from a First-Time Attendee of the HMA Area 2023 Festival Conference

Before I try to describe how this conference impacted me, I should give you some information about what makes me excited musically. I am a lover of ensembles of all types. Making a piece of music come alive with a group of voices, instruments, or bells working together as a participating musician is something of which I never tire. Equally enjoyable is being able to direct an ensemble in the process of doing it.

While I had ample opportunity to participate in instrumental and vocal ensembles during my K-12 school years, though I loved the sound of a handbell choir, I never had the opportunity to participate in one until 3 years ago. As bells or chimes were available in places where I taught or directed, I made a place in the activities to insert them, but at that time I had neither enough manpower nor knowledge to develop their capabilities to the fullest. After joining 2 bell choirs several years ago, I found that one of the things I most enjoyed was being a contributing member to the huge blocks of sound in big chordal sections. Obviously, that emotion was magnified many times as I participated in a huge group of bell choirs. Sometimes, the cloud of sound the large group would be making was overwhelming, in a positive sense.

Another takeaway from the festival, for me, was working under directors who conducted with motions that were so clear in the way they pulled out the exact expression desired. I always have a goal to keep my eyes in contact with the linear movement of the printed music, so as not to lose my place, but, at the same time, look at the director, consistently enough to read all the signals he or she is communicating. I find that challenging. The directors made that process easier for me.

As with any music festival gathering, attendees mix, get to know, and play with many different people from many different places. I found that rewarding as I cooperated with so many I had never met, yet had the opportunity with which to make music.

Also, of note were the excellent offerings of classes in which one could clarify and improve techniques already in use, as well as learn new ones. Applying new input was easy in the very "hands-on" setting. Overall, I found the festival to be stimulating, satisfying, and educational. I believe I'm "hooked" and will need to come back on future occasions to get a "fix."


