

Hosted by ringers and directors in multiple locations throughout Area 2 during the months of March, April, and May, the Read & Ring will allow ringers to ring new music, standard repertoire, and forgotten treasures.

FESTIVAL MUSIC RING

An Area 2 Festival Music Ring is a 3-4 hour

Ringers will read through and rehearse the Massed Music Selections for the upcoming Area 2 Festival to be held in the Poconos on Friday, June 27 – Sunday, June 29, 2025. Please let us know at online registration if you will need music, or already have and are rehearsing the Festival music selections. It is hosted by ringers and directors in multiple locations throughout Area 2 during the months of March, April, and May, the Festival Music Ring will allow ringers to prepare for our Area 2 Festival.

Betty Garee inspired all who knew her. Her legacy continues through her music and through the work of those whose lives she touched. Betty Garee epitomized the Guild's motto of "Uniting People Through a Musical Art." The Board trusts that the scholarships will promote musical growth through handbells/handchimes, thereby continuing the work that Betty deeply loved.

Scholarship Guidelines:

Only one scholarship will be awarded to an individual

- 1. Scholarships are available for first-time attendees to the national Director's Seminar or to either of Area II's Read and
- Ring Seminar or Festival Conference.
- 3. All applicants must be a current member in good standing of both AGEHR, Inc. and AGEHR Area II, Inc.
- 3. All applicants must be currently directing or under contract to direct a handbell/handchime choir or using
- 4. handbells/handchimes in a school program in Area II.
- 5. Applications must be postmarked by May 1, of the year in which the award is being sought.
- 6. A committee appointed by the Chair of Area II will review all applications and select the recipients. Area II reserves all rights as to the number of annual awards, and the right to award all, some, or none of the scholarships based upon the number of applicants, their qualifications, and allotted funds available. The decision of the Area II Board is final.
- Previous winners of the Garee Scholarship are ineligible to apply as are members of the Area II Board.

# ELECTIONS

# **Board Election Information**

Wow! It seems like this 2-year term has just flown by! It's coming to the end of my term as Chair and I don't even feel like I have caught my breath. Plus, it's already time to talk about elections again. The Area 2 Board members work on a 2-year term. There are 5 elected positions (They makeup the Executive Board) as well as 5 appointed positions that make up the full Board. Of the 5 elected positions, 3 run in every election. The only positions that don't run are the Chair and Past-Chair. That job runs as a 6-year commitment that starts with getting elected as the Chair-Elect. That person then moves to Chair, and then to Past-Chair. Each spot is 2 years of the 6-year commitment. The 5 appointed positions are appointed by the incoming Chair and approved by the outgoing Board. These positions are: Membership, Workshops/Mentoring, Communications, Education, and Historian. Every 2 years, we vote for the Chair-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer. That means we need people to run for these 3 positions. Our bylaws state that we must have at least 2 candidates for each position in order to hold the election. The Secretary and Treasurer are able to serve 3 2-year terms before they have to leave the Board. But, even if the incumbents wish to remain for a second or third term, they have to run again every 2 years and they need an opponent. I encourage each of you to consider whether you would be willing to serve on our Board. I think it is important to bring in fresh perspectives as often as possible in order to effectively meet the needs of our membership. Otherwise, things get stagnant. The time commitment varies significantly based on the position you fill. Obviously, some positions have greater responsibilities than some of the others, but everyone is needed in order to make the Area run smoothly. If you think you might be willing to serve in any of the positions that make up the Board, I urge you to contact me to discuss the responsibilities of the various roles.

#### What is the time commitment like?

We meet once every 2 months on a Friday evening. The first meeting of the term is usually in person so we can pass along any materials from outgoing to incoming members. The other meetings are via video conference. Because we are meeting so often, we are able to keep each meeting fairly short (or at least we try!). Board members are expected to assist with the various events that are organized by the Area. Everyone is expected to attend the Festival Conference in odd years. All of the other events only require the assistance of a few board members. Everyone has responsibilities for various tasks between meetings. We communicate often via email as we need to in order to provide needed information on our progress. Please consider stepping up in order to help us ensure that our Board Leadership remains well-connected with the membership and no one person (or small group of people) is/are having to do it all. We would really like to have a ballot in place by mid-summer at the latest so we can hold elections in time to transition to the new Board on October 1, 2025. That is the start of our fiscal year and the new term. And remember...even of you can't serve on the Board, make it a point to talk to us about what YOU want to see happening in our Area. We aren't psychic and we welcome any new ideas you can send our way.
